



Thinking about early Fall I remember that we have many tasks that go along with the season. When the leaves fall it was always our job to rake them into a big pile. I remember jumping into the pile of leaves before we burned them and boy was that fun. We made a parade of the children around the smoking pile of leaves. I always had fun when I would go to the parade. Bushes also needed trimming and then we had to rake the trimmed pieces up and throw them away.

I remember when I was young I had to clean out the fireplace with a shovel and broom, that was a dirty job. We had a wood stove and it was my job to cut and split the wood to keep the house warm in the colder months. We never had to worry about the power going out during a storm. To stay warm all we needed was the wood I cut. Something we did have to worry about was making sure the hot water heater was turned off when we were done using it or it could blow up house and all.
