2024 is a Leap Year, That means 366 days this year!

Some of you may already know that this year "2024" is a Leap Year. Well you may ask what does that mean to everybody? It means everyone gets an extra day this year. That's right 2024 will have 366 days in it. Also if you are born on this day your Birthday will forever be on February 28th or March 1st except for every 4 years when your Birthday lands on your actual day the 29th of February. Unfortunately you still age the same as everyone else, you just don't get to celebrate your birthday on the actual date but once every four years. There is also a superstition that says on Feb. 29th ladies can ask the man of their dreams to marry them. That's right, go ahead ladies and break tradition by asking your guy to marry you! Hope he says yes!



So, What is Shrove Tuesday, Pancake Day or Fat Tuesday?

Pancake Day, or Shrove Tuesday, is the traditional feast day before the start of Lent on Ash Wednesday. Lent – the 40 days leading up to Easter – was traditionally a time of fasting and on Shrove Tuesday, Christians went to confession and were "shriven" (absolved from their sins). A bell would be rung to call people to confession. This came to be called the "Pancake Bell" and is still rung to this day.

Shrove Tuesday always falls 47 days before Easter Sunday, so the date varies from year to year and falls between February 13th and March 28, in 2024 Shrove Tuesday will fall on February 13th.

Shrove Tuesday was the last opportunity to use up eggs and fats before embarking on the Lenten fast and pancakes are the perfect way of using up these ingredients.

A pancake is a thin, flat cake, made of batter and fried in a frying pan. A traditional English pancake is very thin and is served immediately. Golden syrup and butter are usually the toppings used for pancakes.


